1. Introduction

In 2008 the CRFM published the first ever directory of fisheries stakeholders in the Caribbean (Parsram and McConney, 2008). It is the intention of the CRFM to have the directory updated regularly to ensure that the information contained therein is kept relevant and useful for fisheries stakeholders in the Caribbean and any other interested parties. This is the first updated version of the directory which continues to focus on members of the Caribbean Regional Fisheries Mechanism (CRFM). Below we outline the contents and suggest how you may use the directory. Last, we know that you, the reader and user of the directory, can make a valuable contribution to keeping it up to date and relevant. We suggest how you can help and be acknowledged for contributing to your directory.

1.1 Project background

This updated directory is one of the many outputs of the project on *Development of Caribbean Network of Fisher Folk Organizations* to serve the Member States of the CRFM. The project is being implemented by the Caribbean Regional Fisheries Mechanism (CRFM), through its Secretariat, in financial partnership with the ACP-EU Technical Centre for Agricultural and Rural Co-operation (CTA) based in the Netherlands.

The demand for such a project was confirmed by the results of a needs assessment concluded in 2004 and subsequent meetings that involved fisher folk in 2004 and 2005. The 2004 CRFM meeting recommended the formation of a regional network of national fisher folk organizations (NFOs). The meeting recognised the need for strengthening institutional capacities of fisher folk organizations through a strategy for addressing the following issues revealed by the needs assessment:

- ✚ Lack of critical mass of NFOs for launching the network defined by the 2004 Belize Workshop
- ✚ Fisher folk organizations' weak management skills
- ✚ Insufficient access to relevant information by fisher folk
- ✚ Fisher folk organizations' limited communication and advocacy skills.

The 2005 meeting produced a *Strategy and Medium Term Action Plan for the Institutional Strengthening of Regional Fisher Folk Organizations - 2006 to 2010* to address the points above. It is through this bottom-up participatory process that the project was designed.

The overall objective of the project is to contribute to improved income earnings, higher standards of living of fisher folk and sustainable use of fishery resources in the Caribbean.

The more specific purpose of the project is to have Institutional capacities of fisher folk organizations developed at the regional, national and community levels.

Countries are embarking on this development process from different starting points. There are three groups.

- ✚ Group 1: countries with officially recognized NFOs are Antigua and Barbuda, Barbados, Belize, Jamaica and Trinidad and Tobago.
- ✚ Group 2: countries with active primary fisher folk organizations (PFOs) but no officially registered NFO are The Bahamas, Dominica, Grenada, Guyana, St. Kitts and Nevis, St. Lucia, and St. Vincent and Grenadines (Anguilla, British Virgin Islands, Montserrat, Turks and Caicos Islands are non-ACP)
- ✚ Group 3: countries with no active PFOs or NFOs are Haiti and Suriname

Several types of activities are planned to achieve the project objective and purpose taking into account all three groups. These overlapping activities include:

- # Awareness and promotion campaign to further sensitize key stakeholders and actors on the benefits of forming NFOs and the regional network of NFOs
- # National consultations to launch of NFOs in the seven Group 2 countries that lack them
- # Sensitization of fisher folk in Haiti and Suriname to establish PFOs as a first step to the possible creation of NFOs
- # Regional fisheries stakeholders workshop to launch the regional network of fisher folk organisations and provide directions for its development
- # Management, communication and advocacy capacities of NFOs and network strengthened
- # Training of trainers workshop so that fisheries extension officers' capacities can be enhanced to provide better information, advisory and training services
- # Training workshop on management of fisher folk organizations
- # Fisher folk and other interested parties provided with relevant information on regional fisheries issues
- # Production and distribution of a briefing note on fisher folk organizations
- # Development and maintenance of a web site especially for supporting the network functions
- # Production and distribution of a newsletter and stakeholders directory (*this book*)

Now that you know how the directory fits into the project, let us deal with using it.

1.2 Using the directory

Member States of CARICOM (including the OECS) and the CRFM are rich in many types of resources. Resources are not only fish, but the many agencies and individuals in the 18 countries and territories of this project that have an interest in the fisheries of the Caribbean. If you have a strong interest in something, can affect it, or be affected by it ... then you are a *stakeholder*. There are many stakeholders in Caribbean fisheries.

Stakeholders have important roles to play in fisheries management (conservation and development) and generally in how fisheries are governed (fisheries governance). Yet, because fishing locations are spread out over a wide area in the Caribbean, it is often difficult to know who the stakeholders are and how to contact them.

Why would you want to contact other fisheries stakeholders? There are several possible reasons depending on the situation. In the context of a network of national fisher folk organisations (NFOs), which is what this project and directory is mainly about, you need to keep in touch with other NFOs and some primary fisher folk organisations (PFOs) to know what they are doing so you can collaborate with them. This may be to join in on a project or activity, to solve problems together, to arrange to visit them or just to exchange information on any topic at all.

You may want to reach government agencies (national and regional) for information or assistance, tell them what your goals and objectives are, and inform them about what you are doing to help yourself and other fisher folk organisations (FFOs). United Nations (UN) and other international agencies, non-governmental organisations (NGOs), marine and fisheries consultants, private sector businesses, funding institutions, learning institutions and various other organisations can also be partners in activities, sources of information and assistance, agencies that you want to keep informed and serve many purposes related to the fishing industry. You won't run out of ideas on how to interact with stakeholders once you get the ball rolling.

However, getting that ball rolling can be difficult. What do these stakeholder groups do? How can I get information on them before contacting anyone? Calling overseas is expensive and regular posted mail can take a long time. How else can I contact them locally or overseas? Who should I contact? How can I get them to easily reply to me? Can I communicate in real time regionally and internationally at little cost? We may not have the answers to all of your possible questions here in this directory, but below we will try to answer some *frequently asked questions* (or FAQs ... you will see this used on internet sites!).

“What do these different stakeholder groups do?”

The stakeholder groups included in this directory are described in section 2. We give a brief summary of what each type of organisation does that may be most useful to a FFO. We know that not all in a stakeholder group will do exactly the same things, but usually all you need is a general idea to know if you are on the right track. Note that the goals, objectives and functions of an organisation may change over time.

“How can I get information on them before contacting anyone?”

For each country, section 3 gives organisation names, mailing addresses, phone and fax numbers, electronic mail (email) addresses and internet addresses of fisheries stakeholders belonging to the different groups described in section 2. This is the main part of the directory, but you can also use Index A to find a particular organisation by its name based on alphabetic order. Index B arranges organisations by membership in the stakeholder groups. Both Index A and B give the page number in this directory that the organisation is on, so you can find any organisation in three different ways.

Once you have the name and location of an organisation it is often possible to find out about them on the internet. It is easy if they have their own web site (listed with them in section 3), but even if they don't someone else may have written about them on the internet and you can do a key word search to find out. It is quick and easy.

“Besides a letter or phone call, how can I contact organisations locally or overseas?”

Other means require a bit more technology. You can send a fax as easily as making a phone call once you and the receiving organisation both have access to fax machines. This is often the best way to send small documents that are not in electronic format.

If you have an electronic document or photo, or can convert a paper one to either (via a scanner, for example), then you can use email to send messages, documents, photos and more. This is simple and cheap if both parties communicating have computers and access to the internet. Indeed, communicating via computer is now the rule rather than the exception. The cheap cost of operating usually justifies the investment.

“Who should I contact?”

For some organisations we have supplied the names of contact persons or positions in the organisation. However, since people go on leave, change jobs, or get promoted, it may be best to investigate who is the best contact for a particular item at a particular time before you make your main enquiry or send a major document. Establishing some personal contacts can be very useful. It is part of networking.

“How can I get them to easily reply to me?”

For local organisations giving your phone number (preferably with voice mail) may be adequate. For overseas contacts that use computers it will be in your interest to get an email address. It could be your personal address, that of your FFO or one belonging to a trusted person who tells you when mail arrives and allows you to reply by email.

“Can I communicate in real time regionally and internationally at little cost?”

All of the means of communication mentioned above (e.g. fax, email) tend to have delays. Overseas calls in the region tend to be expensive. However, if you and the other stakeholder both have internet access it is now possible to have a real-time two-way conversation by typing messages or by voice similar to a phone call. To do this is not difficult, but it requires knowledge of computers. These items are not covered in this directory, but if you have electronic contact information for stakeholders it is often easy to communicate with them.

No doubt you will have additional questions as you begin to use the directory. Ask colleagues for assistance or drop a line (by email) to the CRFM Secretariat for help.

1.3 Your contribution

So, how can you contribute to the directory? New stakeholders are always springing up and some fade or they change name and other contact information that makes the directory out of date with wrong information. When you realise that something in the directory is not correct, tell your NFO or the CRFM Secretariat so that it can be fixed in the next issue. We suggest that the directory be updated about every two years.

2. Stakeholder groups described

The descriptions of the stakeholder groups used to organise this directory are fairly general in order to capture the main features of the different organisational types.

2.1 Fisher folk organisations

FFOs may be primary or local (e.g. concerns a geographic area or particular fishery), secondary or national (an umbrella organisation) or tertiary such as sub-regional or regional. The network of NFOs is such a regional body. The primary goal of most FFOs is to look after the welfare and development of their members, whether these are individuals or organisations. FFOs are usually either some form of cooperative or association. In the Caribbean most FFOs belong to the harvest sector (comprise fishers and boat owners), but some include postharvest fisher folk (vendors, processors). They engage in a wide range of activities in order to meet the needs of members. It is among FFOs that communication and collaboration need to be very well developed.

2.2 Funding institutions

Organisations that provide funds as grants and loans fall into this category. Fishing enterprises (e.g. boats and processing plants) deal with commercial banks, national development banks and credit unions for loans. However, what this directory is mainly concerned with are the agencies that are donors of grant funds for fisheries projects. FFOs can approach these funding institutions with proposals that outline what funds and other resources are needed to assist their members. There are many different kinds of donors within and outside the region. Their funding priorities change, often from year to year, so that you need to check very current information on funding institutions before contacting them. Most will have internet sites to make this easy.

2.3 Learning institutions

Agencies that regularly offer fisheries-related training and full-time educational places such as universities, colleges and fisheries schools are learning institutions. The Caribbean Fisheries Training and Development Institute (CFTDI) in Trinidad and Tobago is one of the best known in the region for practical industry-oriented training. The University of the West Indies (UWI) has awarded many fisheries officers their undergraduate and graduate degrees. However, schools of continuing education, business institutes and the like that offer courses in computing, literacy, management and many other topics are also learning institutions of interest to FFOs that want to improve the capacity of officers or further the education of members. In this directory we focus on those most closely related to fisheries, but there are many more general institutions of learning.

2.4 Marine and fisheries consultants

These consultants are individuals who are highly trained in some aspect of fisheries. They make their living, self-employed or within a consulting firm, by selling their knowledge and expertise to carry out tasks for which they were hired by clients. They advise or assist on building marine structures, doing fish stock assessments, setting up FFOs, facilitating workshops and almost any other topic concerning fisheries. A FFO may want to hire a consultant to assist in a particular project, providing expertise and adding temporary capacity in a critical area for an appropriate consulting fee.

2.5 National government agencies

Typical government agency stakeholders range from the fisheries authority to the unit handling coastal management. Within a particular government ministry there may be several departments, divisions, units or offices that are stakeholders. Some of them, such as the Fisheries Division, may play roles in the everyday operation of the fishing industry. Others, such as the Coast Guard or Customs, have narrower roles. We list only the agencies that are most often dealt with. It is useful to know the jurisdictions and responsibilities of the various agencies, and be aware that many of them overlap. Government agencies such as ministries may change names and addresses fairly often.

2.6 Non-governmental organisations

Non-governmental organizations (NGOs) are civil society institutions that are not government-run. Many NGOs, at the local through to international levels, are actively involved in fisheries. They may be environmental groups, sport fishing associations, community-based organizations (CBOs) concerned with culture or social services and much more. This directory is concerned with those that are most actively involved with fisheries issues at the local, national, and regional levels in the Caribbean. Fisher folk groups fall into this category, and many are listed here. In many places NGOs are networked or structured into larger organizations with two or more levels such as the umbrella fishing cooperatives. Non-fishing NGOs can be like-minded useful partners.

2.7 Private sector businesses

There are many private businesses in the fishery sector of the Caribbean. These can include fisheries-related enterprises such as fish processors, exporters, fishing boat charters, etc. The main aim of the private sector is profit-making. Fisher folk are part of the private sector. Fishing (harvest and postharvest) is a business. Businesses may negotiate with each other and with government for incentives, partnerships or other benefits, and make deals of all sorts even though they may compete as well. The directory only lists a few directly involved in the fishing industry.

2.8 Regional inter-governmental organisations

These are organizations at the regional level with memberships and/or mandates from more than one government. In other words, they represent a cluster of governments. Some of these include CARICOM bodies such as the CRFM with its Secretariat, the OECS ESDU and others. Some regional organisations may provide funds and technical assistance. Others look after enforcement and aspects of regional coordination. Policy that is implemented at the national level is often set or agreed to at the regional level in meetings of these organisations such as the Caribbean Fisheries Forum and the Ministerial Council of the CRFM.

2.9 UN and other international agencies

International organizations have memberships and mandates that extend beyond the Caribbean. These include organizations such as the many under the United Nations, development banks, donors, NGOs, etc. that are international in geographic scope and often headquartered outside of the region. One of the most important for fisheries is the UN Food and Agriculture Organization (FAO). International agencies may have several subsidiary or regional offices and many departments or divisions dealing with specific matters. Many of them have web sites on the internet that provide useful information on what they do, documents to download, links to other sites and more.

2.10 Non-CARICOM Stakeholders

National, regional, international organizations and individuals beyond CRFM member states that are involved in fisheries and fisherfolk related activities such as funding, training, networking, capacity building etc. This category also includes fisherfolk organizations in neighbouring Latin American countries and those from South Pacific.

3. Stakeholders by their location

This section presents the contact information of stakeholders in each of the eighteen (18) member states of the Caribbean Regional Fisheries Mechanism. Each entry is placed in a stakeholder group as described in Section 2 above and listed in each table. Categories, e.g. consultant or fisher folk, are in alphabetic order for each country.

Each contact entry in the directory is provided in the format outlined and described in the table below. Use this key to remind yourself of the order of information.

7. Appendix

7.1 Instructions for updating Directory (applies to Microsoft Office Word 2003)

1. On the **Tools** menu, point to **Letters and Mailings**, and then click **Mail Merge**.
2. Under Select document type, click **Directory**. The active document becomes the main document (main document: CRFM Fisheries Stakeholder Directory being updated). Click Next: **Starting document**. The task pane guides you through the rest of the mail merge process.
3. Click **Start from existing document**. In the **Start from existing** box, select the document you want, and then click **Open**. Click **Next: Select recipients**. In this case, the list of recipients is the access database file of CRFM Fisheries Stakeholders directory. Follow the guided instruction on the task pane to select recipients to be updated.
4. Having selected your recipients, click **next: Arrange your directory**. At this point, don't include text that you want to print only once in the resulting directory document for example, the introduction and instructions in using the directory.
5. In the main document, click where you want to insert an address block with name, address, and other information. Click **Address block**. In the Insert Address Block dialog box, select the address elements you want to include and the formats you want, and then click OK.
6. Click **more items**. Do one of the following: To select address fields that will automatically correspond to fields in your data source, even if the data source's fields don't have the same name as your fields, click **Address Fields**. To select fields that always take data directly from a column in a database, click **Database Fields**. In the Fields box, click the field you want. Click Insert, and then click Close.
7. Click **Next: Complete the merge**. Click **To New Document**. Follow guided instruction to complete merge. Microsoft Word opens a single new document that contains all the individual records.
8. Add headers, footers, and any other text that you want. Save or print the directory just as you would any regular document.
